ANTI BULLYING WEEK 2018

We have taken part in Anti Bullying Week 2018 this week. We work hard every day to ensure that we choose respect, think about others and try to be an 'upstander' rather than a bystander, but this annual week gives us a whole school focus at the same time.

We have worked hard to understand the difference between being mean or grumpy, and bullying, and how it is SO important to show the key virtues of empathy and compassion. We are so proud of our children and the very mature discussions we have had this week. Here's a snapshot of our activities:

Mousehole – we talked about choice and respect, what it means and how we make choices & respect others. We talked about being different and unique & coloured in odd socks for our class washing line.

Godrevy – we looked at the video 'For the Birds' and completed a wrinkled heart activity to show how we can hurt others and how to support our school family.

Longships – we have discussed what it means to be different & what it means to be a good friend. We then made a hand of friendship wreath. Pendeen – we used Dinosaur Chase (a story) which describes how one dinosaur is isolated because he is different, but how all the other dinosaurs need his support in the end. The children explored their feelings and reactions. 3C – we made 'Choose Respect' friendship bracelets. We each made one for ourselves and one to share.

3J – we have explored different scenarios & role played how to react. We also made posters on the Choose Respect theme.

4 – we learned an anti-bullying song to increase our awareness of the importance of respect for everyone.

5 – we have discussed what respect means & how we can show respect to our classmates. We have created a class charter that details seven actions that we will focus on to show respect. 6L & 6C – we have learned about how different people respond & react in different situations & how we may interpret things in very different ways. We have thought carefully about respecting differences and showing empathy.
