




These results speak for themselves and are two of the most important areas to us.

My child makes good progress at this school.




My child is well looked after at this school.


My child is well taught at this school.


My child receives appropriate homework for their age.

This school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.






Strongly agree %




This school is well led and managed.

This school responds well to any concerns I have.



I feel this school knows my child's strengths and weaknesses well and is appropriately challenged with these.



If you had a worry regarding the safety of a child, would you know who to approach at school?




Would you like more guidance on e-safety?




Are you aware of who the Governors are and what they do?



Performance Data

Every term our children work on a series of tasks, mostly without them being aware, to give us information on their progress. Every summer Year 6 and Year 2 are required to publish results of SATs tests to show progress at these key stages of learning. Incidentally next year is the last time this will be done this way. At the time of writing this was not as up to date as it should be, so I have included some graphs to show our school performance at the end of Year 6 compared to Cornwall and National averages.
