We have been very busy celebrating and enjoying Science Week this week. On Tuesday, we were very lucky to have Google Expeditions in school and all the children from Year 1 to Year 6 took part in the workshops, travelling around the world - and beyond - on virtual journeys. It was incredible! Over the rest of the week Mousehole Class investigated super hero powers of magnets, bubble blowing and melting ice, Godrevy and Trevose found out about animals, including humans, and Class 2 explored lots of different materials. Class 3 were busy trying to make giant bubbles and discover why bubbles are usually round. Class 4 used boiled eggs to discover which liquids are harmful to teeth, while Ocean Class found out a lot about Space, the moon and seasons. Jungle Class looked at separating materials, changing states of solids (including chocolate!) and Class 6 have made shadow puppets and investigated light. What a wonderful time!
