PLEASE BE SAFE

There have been some recent incidents of parents and children walking up Rodda's Road and feeling unsafe as cars are passing them. Drop off and pick up times at school are always busy and we must all try to do all we can to ensure the safety of others.

It would really help if parents and carers do not drive up and down Rodda's Road during these busy times. The road is full of holes, as well as families, and is not ideal for driving. It is quicker and safer if all cars drive through the village on the road. It leaves Rodda's Road free for families to walk up and down in a safe route.

No-one would want to see a child injured and we feel strongly that following this guidance will really help to keep everyone safe. There is no way to legally enforce this, but we appeal to everyone's common sense and shared goal of keeping children safe.



PARKING PLEA

Please don't park in the staff car park, or in the disabled space, as both are needed and are in constant use.

DROP OFF ZONE

Please do not park in the drop off zone. If we don't keep the flow of traffic moving in this area, the car park and surrounding areas soon become congested.

ASSESSMENTS

Over the last month, many of our children have experienced a variety of 'quizzes', from Phonics Screening for Year One, to End of Key Stage Assessments for Years One and Two, to the Multiplication Tables Check for Year Four. As a school, we view these as one part of our assessments and believe that excellent teaching and a love for school will ensure that all children give of their best, so try not to make these testing times into a big thing. We are very proud of how our children have taken all of this in their stride.
