

<u>Mathematics</u> We follow a Mastery approach to teaching maths and this term, we will be focussing on: - Place Value - Four operations - Fractions - Position and direction	<u>Art</u> 2D Drawing to 3D Making – Pupils will explore how 2D drawings can be transformed to 3D objects. Work towards a sculptural outcome or a graphic design outcome. <u>DT</u> Seasonal Cooking – Pupils will investigate, explore, design, plan, make and evaluate seasonal biscuits. <u>French</u> This is Me – Pupils will participate in brief conversations about themselves and others, use adjectives to describe personalities and write sentences about their personality and physical appearance. Homes and Houses – Pupils will use a sequence of sentences with nouns and adjectives to describe a house. They will ask and answer questions using prepositions.	<u>Music</u> We will follow the Charanga scheme unit, 'Happy'. This unit is focused around one song: Happy by Pharrell Williams - a Pop song with a Soul influence about being happy. <u>RE</u> How Do Christians Decide How To Live? What Would Jesus Do? Pupils will identify features of Gospel texts and how these help Christians live their lives. Why do Christians believe that Jesus is the Messiah? – Pupils will study the Incarnation and Messiah within the 'big story' of the Bible and how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus' Incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating Christmas.	<u>PE</u> Following our Complete PE Scheme, in PE this term, we will be focusing on our invasion skills in netball and tchoukball, and in gymnastics we will concentrate on matching and mirroring. We will also look at leadership and health related exercise. <u>PSHE</u> Pupils will be thinking about their relationships with others and the importance of valuing our differences, making use of the SCARF curriculum.	<u>English</u> Grammarsaurus (The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar) – Pupils will be focusing on different areas within grammar, starting with a noun focus and then moving onto verbs and finally subject/verb focus. Non-Chronological Reports – Pupils will investigate the mythology of dragons and create a non-chronological report. Song Lyrics – Titanium by David Guetta. Pupils will look at chronology of events and create a prequel. Poetry – Bethlehem by Carol Ann Duffy. Pupils will explore the patterns and language used to create their own versions of this seasonal poem.	
<u>Science</u> Animals including humans - Pupils will investigate the circulatory system, looking particularly at the heart, lungs and blood vessels. We will also be investigating how to keep our bodies healthy. Evolution and Inheritance – Pupils will explore what inherited characteristics lead to variation and adaptive traits. They will learn about theories of evolution and evidence to support these. They will study the different stages of human evolution.					<u>Reading</u> Reading and listening to your child read every day makes a big difference to their progress in all areas of learning. Reading for pleasure is something we encourage and we always welcome discussion about books and poetry in class. Please reinforce this love of reading at home with your children and ensure that they bring their reading books to school each day. Along with opportunities to read for pleasure in class, pupils will take part in more formal reading fluency sessions where we will focus on developing reading skills, such as prediction, inference, vocabulary choices and authorial intent. During these sessions, we will explore a variety of fiction, non-fiction texts and poetry.
<u>Computing</u> Communication – Pupils will learn about the World Wide Web as a communication tool. We will explore how search engines work (including how they select and rank results), what influences searching and compare different search engines. We will investigate different methods of communication, before focusing on internet-based communication. Web Page Creation – Pupils will manipulate and adjust images for a particular purpose. They will understand that a vector image is comprised of separate objects and vector graphics are made from lines and shapes.
