


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#### **Recommended Read**

### Census Day Menu

Next Thursday 5th October, is a National School Census Day, when the Department for Education (DfE) collects information about each school to help them plan for the future and, most importantly, the data is used to set future school budgets. One of the figures we must report is the number of Reception and Years 1 & 2 children who are having a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on this day.

The census data is then used to decide how much funding for the year we receive for our hot meals.

We do not receive funding for the number of hot meals we supply, only the number of meals eaten on the census days each year.

Our solution to this problem is to ask every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the school meal (or part of it) on Census Day. Please book as usual on ParentPay but instead of the options shown for 5th October we will be serving the popular 'Build a Burger' served with wedges, sweetcorn and baked beans followed by chocolate brownie. Jacket potato and hot tomato pasta will also be available. Your child will then be fully funded to have hot meals during the year thus saving the school any additional costs. You are welcome to send in a packed lunch as a back-up.

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### **Dry Triathlon**

The week starting Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October Mount Hawke Academy, in conjunction with FOMHS, will be holding a year 1 to year 6 Dry Triathlon (a scoot/bike, row and run) day.

The event will take place throughout the school day with every year group taking part in this fun and exciting challenge.

We are certain that you and your family will want to support your child in participating in this event. By sponsoring them, you will also be supporting the school, and raising money to buy new PE equipment. Sponsorship can be made either via cash on the attached form, or by using the Triathlon donation item on ParentPay.

All children will receive a certificate to recognise their achievements on the day and there will be fun rewards to recognise outstanding effort.

It is that time of year – if you have a child in Year Six, please make sure that you complete their application for secondary school before 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023. It is important that you name more than one preference. This will not give you less chance of securing a place at your preferred school. Please also check your eligibility for Home to School Transport before naming your preferences.


