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Census Day Menu

Thursday 19th May is a National School Census Day, where we must report is the number of Reception and Years 1 & 2 children who are having a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on this day. This data is used to decide how much funding for the year we receive for our hot meals. We do not receive funding for the number of hot meals we supply, only the number of meals eaten on the census days each year.

Our solution to this is to ask every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the school meal (or part of it) on Census Day, which is the popular 'Hot Dog' served with wedges and beans followed by ice cream sundae. Your child will then be fully funded to have hot meals during the year thus saving the school any additional costs. You are welcome to send in a packed lunch as a back-up. Thank you for your support.
