COOL TO BE KIND!

Next week is the annual Anti Bullying Week. We have put a lot of thought into this and have decided to make a bit of a change this year. We have talked a lot in school this year already about following the most simple rule of life...to be kind. Wednesday is World Kindness Day and we are going to make this our focus. We will continue to reinforce to the children what bullying is, that it is unacceptable, that it is important (and often tricky) to be an upstander and not a bystander. We are also going to focus on the positive side of human nature, thinking about random acts of kindness that we can carry out for others and to look for the joy in everyday life. Studies have shown that kindness is contagious and the ripple effect of paying kindness forward means that one small act can spread far and wide. It is 'Cool to Be Kind!'

SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT

We are constantly reflecting and working on initiatives to improve further. We have recently taken time to review our curriculum and over the rest of this year we are working on new and improved topics and learning. Our curriculum aims to give our children a secure foundation for their future. We think it is important that they learn about their local area, and also about the wider world. We are also making sure that reading remains at the top of our agenda. The latest refurbishment of the library is currently underway, and we are making sure that book talk is a real focus and buzz around the school. In maths, we are increasing the use of manipulatives - making sure that children know which resources they can use to help them in maths. Things such as counters, bead strings and fraction strips help children physically handle the maths before they write it. The partnership between home and school is so important, and we would like to thank you again for all that you do at home to support your child. Our open door policy is always that - always feel that you can talk to us.
