Maths Update – Rekenreks



We were very pleased to receive a delivery of Rekenreks last week. These are maths frames with groups of five white and five red beads on and they help children with their maths sense. We are lucky enough to be taking part in the Mastering Number project, supported by The Department for Education and The National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Maths. This project aims to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense for all children from Reception through to Year 1 and Year 2. The aim over time is that children will leave Key Stage 1 with fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number. Attention will be given to key knowledge and understanding needed in Reception classes, and progression through

KS1 to support success in the future.

Parent Survey

Thank you to everyone for taking the time to complete our survey. We are always keen to learn of the views of our community. We are delighted that so many of you are very happy with the school, but we are also always very keen to hear when we don't get things right or can improve. A common thread was that you are really missing coming into school, and we are missing this too. We were planning to hold some events this term, but Covid rates and Public Health guidance have prevented this. We are very hopeful that we will be able to welcome you in in some way soon after Christmas, so that you can actually see your child's classroom and have a look at the lovely work in their books that they are so proud of. We will let you know more details when we can. Parents are also keen to find out more about how to help their children develop further, so we will look at how we can improve our communication in this way.

- 96% of parents who responded said that their child is happy at MHA
- 99% said their child feels safe or moderately safe at school
- 96% said that the school makes sure the children are well-behaved

MHA Uniform Reminder

Over the holiday, please take the opportunity to make sure that your child has the correct (and named) uniform for January:

General appearance Hair styles

If your child has hair longer than shoulder length it must be tied back for school.

Children must not have artificially coloured hair or extreme hair styles such as patterns shaved into their hair. They are welcome to wear a base layer under their uniform during colder times.

Make up

Children should not wear make up, including nail varnish, to school.

Jewellery

Children may wear small, plain, stud earrings, and a watch. Children should not wear bangles, bracelets, wrist bands.

Our academy colour is royal blue and our uniform consists of:

- White or royal blue polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt or royal blue cardigan with Mount Hawke Academy logo
- Grey / black school skirt / pinafore dress / school trousers or school shorts (not jeans, leggings, etc)
- Plain tights or socks
- Flat school shoes in black

PE Kit

- White or royal blue t-shirt with or without logo
- Black shorts or black or blue tracksuit bottoms / leggings
- Blue MHA hoodie (optional) these hoodies should only be worn for PE and are not part of general uniform
- Suitable footwear trainers / plimsolls

- The Post Box is open please make sure the recipient's name (first name at least) and class is on the envelope.
