School Census Day

Next Thursday, 20th May 2021, is National School Census Day, when the Department for Education (DfE) collects information about each school to help them plan for the future and, most importantly, the data is used to set future school budgets. One of the figures we must report is the number of Reception and Years 1 & 2 children who are having a Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) on this day.

The census data is then used to decide how much funding for the year we receive for our school meals. This means that if your child does not have a meal on Thursday, we will not receive any further funding for the rest of the year. If your child chooses to have a meal on another day, we will have to fund this from our school budget. We do not receive funding for the number of meals we supply, only the number of meals eaten on the census days each year.

Our solution to this problem is to ask every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to try the school meal (or part of it) on Census Day which is a Hot Dog, or Veggie Hot Dog, or School Packed Lunch followed by Chocolate Brownie and ice cream. Your child will then be fully funded to have School meals during the year thus saving the school any additional costs. You are welcome to send in a home packed lunch as a back-up.

Please remember that we shut the gates at 8.45 am and children need to arrive before this time. Those early moments in school are invaluable and include activities such as maths, handwriting, reading and changing books.

Safety Around the School

Please remember that Rodda's Road can have traffic in it and the road through the village can be very busy. The bus has to reverse to continue its run so please remind your children not to cross behind the bus. We have also reminded the children today not to climb on the hedge or tree outside the school as these are getting damaged and to walk their bikes out through the gate.

The guidance from the Government for primary schools has not changed so please continue to wear masks onsite (unless you are exempt) and socially distance. Thank you for your super support in this – it is wonderful that we haven't had to close any bubbles so far.
